

Checklist for International Degree Students

 - By airplane: Airport Frankfurt/Main or Nürnberg with direct ICE-train connections to Würzburg: <https://www.frankfurt-airport.com/en.html>, <https://www.airport-nuernberg.de/english>
 - By train: Easily accessible from all directions: <https://www.bahn.com/en>.
 - Public transport in Würzburg: With the WVV (timetables at https://www.bayern-fahrplan.de/en/journey-planner?set_language=en) problem-free to the [various university buildings](#) and student dormitories.
 - By car: There are city maps and site plans on the internet for your orientation in town or upon your arrival by car: <https://wueaddress.uni-wuerzburg.de/search/map>.
- **Dormitory**
 - If you have rented a room at a dormitory with the *Studierendenwerk Würzburg*, you can obtain your key from the facilities manager of the respective dormitory during their regular working hours from Monday to Friday. This does not apply on holidays.
 - Please note these holidays when planning your travel! Public holidays in March of April (dates vary each year): Good Friday (*Karfreitag*) and Easter Monday (*Ostermontag*).

 - **The welcome reception** of the International Office Incoming and the Students Affairs Office. The reception takes place a few days before the start of term. You will be informed of the exact time and date.

Documents:

- Passport (non-EU citizens) or ID card (EU citizens)
- Visa (if required)
- Letter of Acceptance
- Confirmation of financial means (e.g., blocked account, scholarship confirmation, only non-EU citizens)
- If paid in home country: Confirmation of payment of semester fee.
- Confirmation of health insurance (see above)
- If available: Vaccination card
- If you want to drive by car in Germany: International driver's license.
- Certificates (School leaving certificate, verification of German language skills, possibly higher education certificate). Bring [translations and legalizations](#) if necessary.

Other

- 220 power adapter or a German plug system adapter
- Clothes for all types of weather. Würzburg enjoys a lot of sun but can also get cold in winter and get rain in spring and fall.
