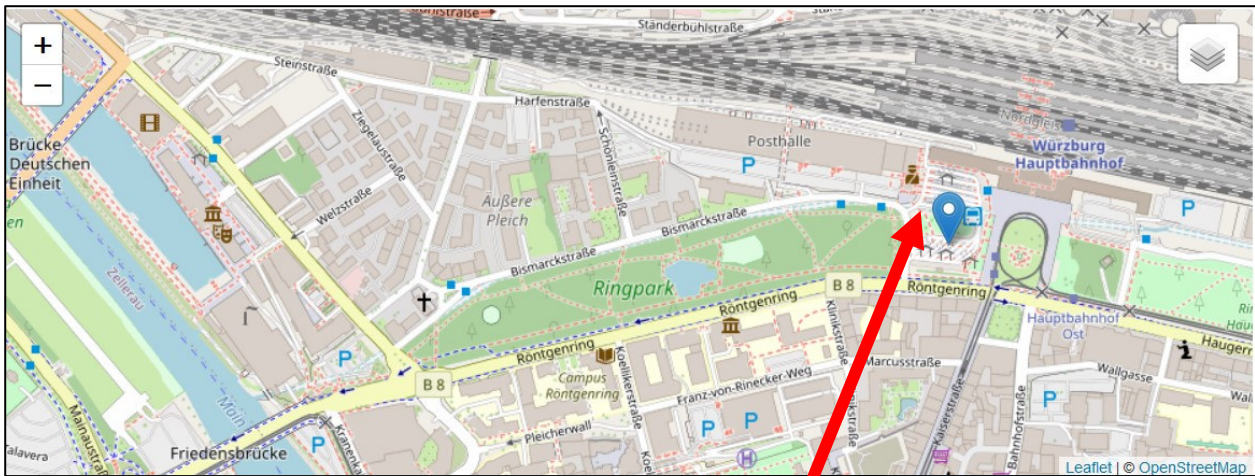


**Full-day excursion by bus to Waldenbuch

11:00 a.m.: Visit to Museum Ritter (art museum) with introduction and short tour of the exhibition by curator Hsiaosung Kok

13:00: walk together from Museum Ritterto the Museum of Everyday Culture (approx. 15 min.)

On 2,500 square metres you can discover outstanding collections with an incomparable thematic range - the Museum of Everyday Culture is one of the most important folklore museums in the German-speaking world. A lot has changed since it was founded in 1989/90 as the "Museum of Folk Culture in Württemberg": From 2010 to 2016, large parts of the Museum of Everyday Culture were fundamentally modernised step by step. The Museum of Everyday Culture focusses on the lives and experiences of ordinary people in the past and today. Hands-on objects and media stations complement the clearly defined themed rooms. Contemporary exhibition architecture makes the tours through the remodelled collections an experience for the whole family.” (Homepage)

“Hands-on exhibition with tinkering workshop: From bottle openers to intelligent robots, from ingenious to curious: inventions characterise our lives and make our everyday lives easier. However, in view of the sheer mass of new things that are constantly being thrown onto the market, the question arises: do all these innovations really solve an existing problem? Do we need it or can we do without it? In addition to the inventions of everyday life, the exhibition also tells the story of everyday inventions. Inventors have their say and visitors can learn the art of invention for themselves with step-by-step instructions.
