This apparatus for continuous exposure essentially consists of a film projector which can either be operated picture by picture by the test person via a magnetic switch or which advances at equal picture intervals via a contact metronome. On the film, arithmetic tasks for measuring the mental performance of the test person are shown. Not shown is an opal glass pane with a viewing window of 13 by 18 centimeters, which is fixed to a metal bar in front of the projector with two screws.
