

# **Checklist for International Degree Students**

After you have applied to study at the University of Würzburg (<u>steps to your application</u>) and have received your letter of acceptance, there are still a few things you will need to do before beginning your studies. The following is a step by step list of what you should do:

- Apply for a student visa (*Visum für Studienzwecke*) at the German Embassy More information.
- Accommodation search <u>More information.</u>
- Take out health insurance Advice on health insurance.
- **Course selection and schedule** Students at German universities plan their own course schedule. <u>More information.</u>
- Getting here
  - By airplane: Airport Frankfurt/Main or Nürnberg with direct ICE-train connections to Würzburg: <u>https://www.frankfurt-airport.com/en.html</u>, <u>https://www.airport-</u><u>nuernberg.de/english</u>
  - By train: Easily accessible from all directions: <u>https://www.bahn.com/en</u>.
  - Public transport in Würzburg: With the WVV (timetables at <u>https://www.bayern-fahrplan.de/en/journey-planner?set\_language=en</u>) problem-free to the <u>various</u> <u>university buildings</u> and student dormitories.
  - By car: There are city maps and site plans on the internet for your orientation in town or upon your arrival by car: <u>https://wueaddress.uni-wuerzburg.de/search/map</u>

### • Dormitory

- If you have reserved a room at a dormitory with the *Studentenwerk Würzburg*, you can obtain your key from the facilities manager of the respective dormitory Monday to Thursday between 7:30 am and 4:00 pm and on Fridays between 7:30 am and 1:00 pm. This does not apply on holidays.
- Please note these holidays when planning your travel! Public holidays in March of April (dates vary each year): Good Friday (*Karfreitag*) and Easter Monday (*Ostermontag*).

Check out the holidays in Bavaria.

• Public holiday on the 3rd of October: Day of German Reunification (*Tag der Deutschen Einheit*).

#### • Enrolment

You should complete your enrolment at the International Students Office as soon as possible after your arrival. <u>More information.</u>

#### • Important events after arrival

You should definitely vistit the following events:

- The orientation event of your faculty. <u>More information.</u>
- The welcome reception and the <u>First Steps orientation event</u> of the International Students Office. The reception takes place a few days before the start of term. You will be informed of the exact time and date as soon as possible.



- Bridge courses will be held before the term officially starts and partly during the enrolment period. You can attend these courses even if you have not been enroled yet. <u>More information</u>.
- Registration of your residence at the registration office <u>More information.</u>
- Apply for a resident permit (NOT for EU citizen) More information.
- Enjoy Würzburg and get to know people Here you can find events and activities.

## Packing list:

#### Documents:

- Passport (non-EU citizens) or ID card (EU citizens)
- Visa (non-EU citizens)
- Letter of Acceptance
- Confirmation of financial means (e.g. scholarship confirmation, only non-EUcitizens)
- If paid in home country: Confirmation of payment of semester fee
- Confirmation of health insurance (see above)
- If available: Vaccination card
- If you want to drive by car in Germany: International drivers licence
- Current biometric passport pictures (2 photos)
- Certificates (School leaving certificate, verification of German language skills, possibly higher education certificate). Bring <u>translations and legalizations</u> if necessary.

#### Other

- 220 power adapter or a German plug system adapter
- Clothes for all types of weather. Würzburg enjoys a lot of sun, but can also get cold in winter and get rain in spring and fall.
