



**We would be happy to get to know something about your professional career and it would be nice if you could describe your professional work in a few words.**

Back from Würzburg I had been working (part-time) at the Andrásy Gyula German University in Budapest for two years as an administrative assistant then I changed to a publishing company where I had been working for 3 years as a marketing assistant and later as an editor at the magazine "Magyar Installateur" (Hungarian Installateur). The chief editor of the magazine and I established a new publishing company last year where we publish "Magyar Installateur" and "Ighx".
