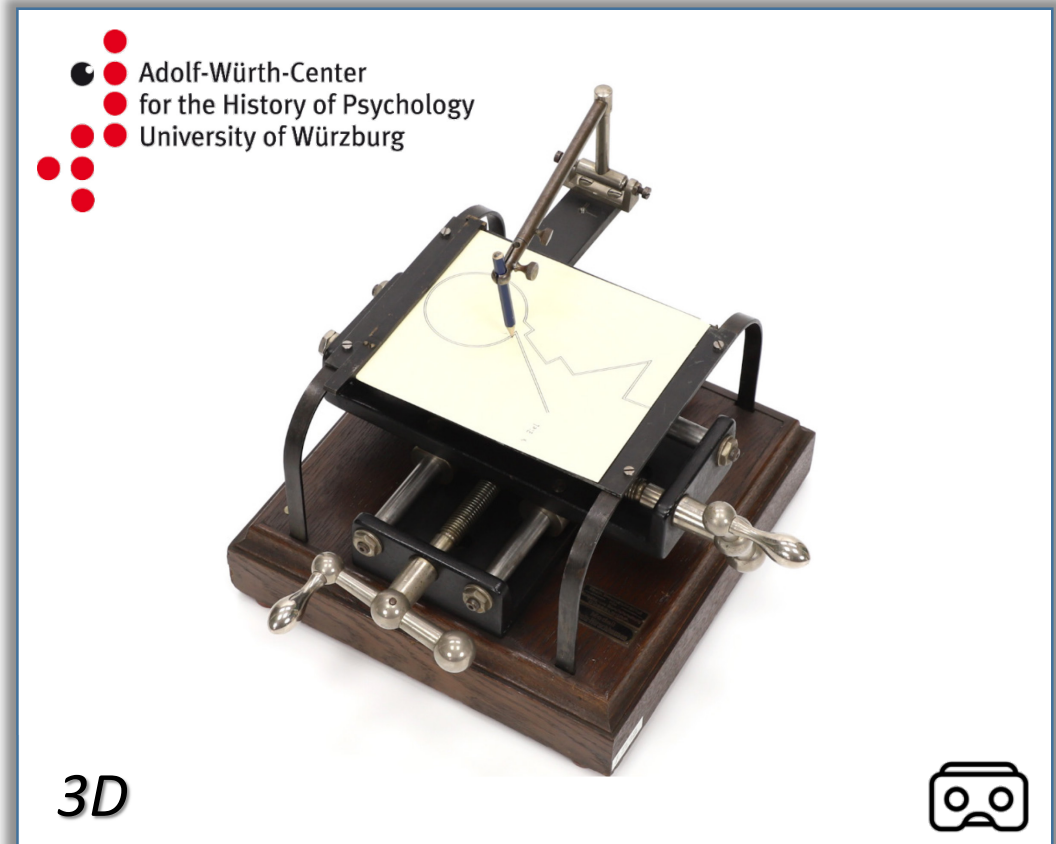


**Two hand tester/ Support apparatus**

In 1930 Walter Moede described the two-hand tester among the test procedures of skills. Depending on the nature of the template, one-handed or two-handed eye-hand coordination is required. Interestingly, Moede pointed out that in this test the instinctive acting types are superior to those who control their actions by intelligence. The procedure was mainly used for the diagnosis of occupational aptitude.
