Language Centre at Julius Maximilian University (“Zentrum für Sprachen”, ZFS)

The Language Centre (“Zentrum für Sprachen”, ZFS) at Julius Maximilian University regularly offers German courses for different levels of proficiency – from beginners to advanced.

All international guests are welcome to register for **the semester** classes.

For foreign researchers and international employees, fees are applicable.

Please note that immersion courses can only be booked by students – not by employees or PhD students who are not enrolled at our university.

The following information, kindly provided by the ZFS, may help you to decide which course might suit you:

Language Levels (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, **CEFR**)

Our courses follow the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages and are thus divided in the following consecutive levels:

If you have no knowledge of a language you want to learn, an A1 course is right for you. If you have studied the language before, please take a placement test here at the ZFS so that we can find the right level for you.

German Courses

For beginners (level A1 and A2 respectively):

You can choose how much time you are able and willing to dedicate to your German studies:

For higher levels of language proficiency:

Starting from B1 level, you can take a general language course (usually 4hrs per week) and add more courses with special focus (speaking, writing, listening, pronunciation, presentations...) that are offered at that level.

There are also online-courses that allow you to study flexibly.

Registration for Courses

The registration for German language courses consists of two steps: there is an online preregistration (see link below) followed by a registration in person on the day given on our homepage. Don't forget your contract/ letter from the faculty where you are employed.

Registration is always at the beginning of the semester. Before registration there are placement tests. Please take a placement test on the day given on our homepage if

you are a new student here and know some German. If you are a complete beginner, the placement test is unnecessary, as you will have to register for the A1 or A1.1 course.
